Basic Disaster Supplies Kit

Be Prepared

Even in Northwest Montana there is a chance for a possible emergency or disaster.

- Flooding
- **Blizzards**
- Power Outages
- Fires
- Etc.

Family Emergency Planning: It is important to have a safe place in which family can meet after an emergency. Planning needs to be done in advance for how you will get to your family's safe location as well as how you will contact one another.

Supplies: Many emergencies and disasters occur without warning. Which makes it important to have plans and supplies in your home as well as locations you often frequent such as work, vehicles, schools, etc.

- $\Rightarrow \ \mbox{Water: One gallon per person per day for at least} \\ three days, for drinking and sanitation$
- $\Rightarrow~$ Food: At least a three day supply of non-perishable food
- \Rightarrow Battery-powered or hand crank radio
- \Rightarrow Walkie-talkies
- \Rightarrow Flashlight/extra batteries
- \Rightarrow First aid kit
- \Rightarrow Warm blankets
- \Rightarrow Change of clothes
- \Rightarrow Matches in water-proof container
- $\Rightarrow \ \ \text{Cell phone}$
- \Rightarrow Cash
- $\Rightarrow \ \ Prescription \ medications$
- \Rightarrow Other items based on personal needs



- Lessen the impact of an emergency with prior planning.
- Prepare a bag that contains personal items to be taken immediately if evacuation occurs.
- Stay informed of changing weather conditions, have an evacuation plan and use it if advised to evacuate.
- Keep home clear of potential dangers during a storm or forest fire. Such as dead tree branches that could blow out, debris close to the house that could catch fire, etc.
- Keep vehicle maintained and stocked with possible needs based on season. Such as winterizing vehicle, keeping sand or cat litter in trunk, a pit shovel, extra warm clothing and basic supplies as listed under Basic Disaster Supplies Kit.
